Reaching Higher

Habitat homeowner achieves her goals and shares what's next



The Dabney Family has been busy making their house a home since moving in last year. When asked, she quickly lists the many things she is enjoying about life there: children playing together in the yard and riding bikes, grilling on the deck, enjoying sunshine on the porch, and observing the peace on a street with no traffic.

Dabney and four others were approved for the homeownership program in the height of the pandemic when production was slow and supplies were back-ordered. Three months later, GLHFH was hit especially hard by the death of Chris Irvine, our construction manager. The building program came to a complete halt.

It took nearly six months to start building again. Thinking back to that time, Dabney said, "It was a long process and I got a little discouraged. But it was well worth it! The house is built with love from others." (She gets us!) In the time between being approved and moving in, she learned what would be required to be a successful homeowner, which inspired her to further her career. She took an intensive course to open new doors in her career and within six months of completing her training she was offered a new job. Dabney is now thriving in her career and as a homeowner.

After acquiring a better job and a quality, affordable home, what is Dabney aiming for now? The same thing we all aspire to – a promising future for her family.



Welcome to Knott Street

Sponsor our next builds to bring more families home

In 2010, the family of James Couch, Jr. donated several land parcels tucked back in a quiet Fort Hill neighborhood. With the City of Lynchburg's federal HUD funds, we constructed 400' of road, sidewalk, and utility infrastructure and created nine lots for single family homes plus a green space. The "Knott St. Extension" was completed in the fall of 2023.

The family who purchased the first home is fully engaged in the community through their work and play. The wide front porch calls for rocking chairs and iced tea. The back deck is all set for a grill and a family barbecue. With three more families moving in this summer, we know the first family of Knott Street will set the tone for this new development and build a community here to be proud of.

The first five homes on Knott Street are sponsored, meaning the costs for the materials and equipment installed are being covered by a donor or group of donors. The good news is that there are still sponsor opportunities available for the remaining four homes. GLHFH is eager to put individuals or groups, businesses, and churches together to achieve the \$95,000 Platinum Hammer sponsorship for a house. 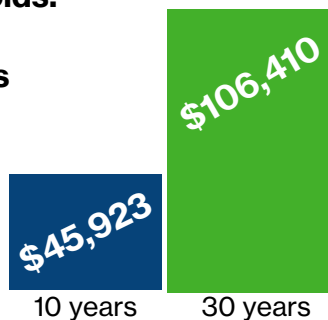

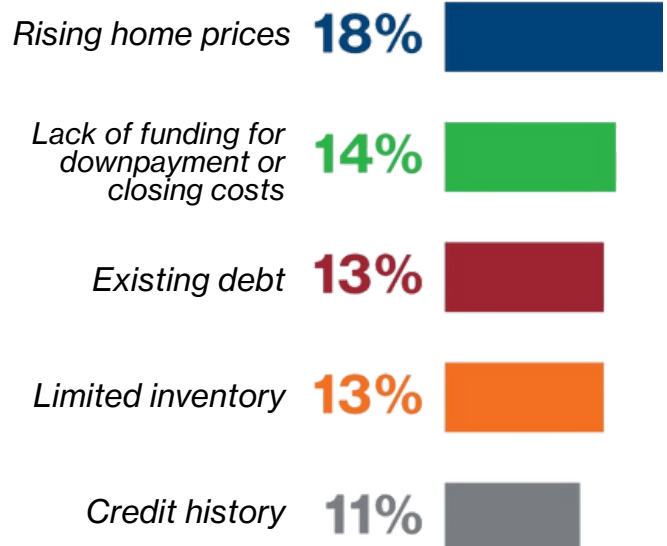
